James V. Fortier, 83, a lifelong resident of Kankakee, passed away Saturday (Feb. 1, 2014) at Presence Heritage Village in Kankakee. Cremation rites have been accorded. A memorial service will be held at a later date at St. Patrick Catholic Church in Kankakee. Inurnment will be in All Saints Cemetery, Bourbonnais.
