James Legg -- Kankakee James "Jimmy" Andrew Legg walked through the Gates of Heaven Wednesday (March 19, 2008) at the all-too-young age of 56. He was born Sept. 23, 1951, in Kankakee, and lived the majority of his life in Aroma Park, where he was well-known and loved. He owned a three-wheel bike that was his biggest joy. He enjoyed the freedom of visiting his friends. Jimmy would put thousands of miles on his beloved bike in the course of spring, summer, and fall, all over Aroma Park and its rivers. As a young child, he was the poster boy for Easter Seals. Jim graduated in 1970 from Westview High School. He worked at the Kankakee Training Center while in his 20s. He was also a huge Cubs fan, and enjoyed watching the Chicago Bears (win or lose!) and NASCAR racing. He was a member of the Kankakee Jaycees in the early '80s. He loved to watch the boat races at the Kankakee Regatta every year on Labor Day weekend. He leaves behind his beloved father, Donald Legg; brother, Robert; sisters, Laurie (Greg) Martin and Donna; nephew, Benjamin Martin; nieces, Amy Wyse and Tami (Derek) Murphy; great-niece, Alexis Wyse; and numerous cousins and beloved friends. He was preceded in death by his mother, Clarice James Legg; grandparents, Harry and Alice James, Leslie and Isabel Legg; and great-nephew, Alex Wyse. Visitation will be from 2 p.m. to 8 p.m. today at the Clancy-Gernon-Hertz Funeral Home, west Kankakee. Cremation rites will be accorded by the Clancy-Gernon-Hertz Crematory. made to the family wishes.

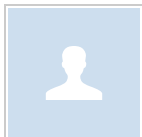
