James "Jim" G. Sprimont, 86, of St. Anne, Illinois, entered a new life on Saturday December 4, 2021 at his home.

After graduating in 1958, he began working in the family business, Sprimont Insurance Agency Inc, of St. Anne Illinois. James eventually retired from the insurance business at the age of 72.

He was an active parishioner of St. Teresa Catholic Church and was a member of the church choir and also served on the school board.

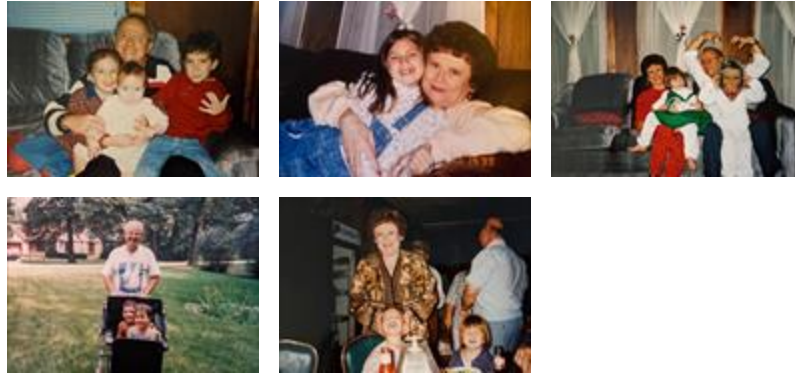
