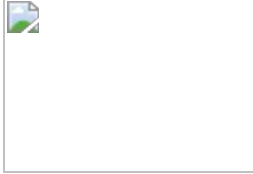

Janet Cox -- Kankakee Visitation for Janet C. Cox, 78, of Kankakee, will be from 10 a.m. Saturday until the 11 a.m. memorial services at St. Paul's Episcopal Church, Kankakee, where she was a member. Inurnment will be in St. Paul's Episcopal Church Columbarium in Kankakee. Memorials may be made to the family wishes. She died Tuesday (Nov. 13, 2007) at ManorCare Health Services. According to her wishes, her body has been donated to science. Clancy-Gernon Funeral Home, Bourbonnais, is in charge of arrangements. Mrs. Cox had worked at Provena St. Mary's Hospital for 11 years; prior to that she had been a reporter for The Daily Journal. She was born Aug. 28, 1929, in Canton, Ohio, the daughter of John B. and Rose Brosk Copley. Her husband, Herbert E. Cox, whom she married Nov. 22, 1951, in Canton, died April 15, 1983. She was a member of the Woman's Club of Kankakee, the Emblem Club, and the Kankakee Garden Club. She had been a volunteer at Provena St. Mary's Hospital. Surviving are one daughter and son-in-law, Rebecca and Andy Guentert of Crown Point, Ind.; nephews and their children, Mark (Martha) Laubacher of Chicago (Claire and Carl), Dan (Jennifer) Laubacher of Chicago (Alexander and Gabriel), David Laubacher of Chicago, James Laubacher of Palm Springs, Calif., and Robert (Maureen) Laubacher of Cambridge, Mass. (Grace and Charles). Deceased are her parents; one daughter, Cynthia Cox; and one sister.

Jan had my admiration for several reasons and one of them was the way she worked with her incapacitation and did not give up but rather set an example for the rest of us.
