Jerry D. Ginger, 64, of Bradley, died Saturday (March 3, 2007) at his daughter's residence in Manteno. Visitation will be from 4 p.m. to 8 p.m. Monday at Clancy-Gernon-Hertz Funeral Home, west Kankakee and from 9 a.m. Tuesday at St. Paul's Lutheran Church in Kankakee until the 10 a.m. funeral services.
