John N. Dades, 88, of Bourbonnais, died Tuesday (Nov. 27, 2012) at Miller Center in Kankakee. Visitation will be from 10 a.m. Friday until the 11 a.m. funeral service at Clancy-Gernon Funeral Home in Bourbonnais.
