Surviving are his wife, the former Rose Mary Brais, whom he married June 28, 1947, in Chicago; five sons and daughters-in-law, Craig and Sylvia Greenhill of St. John, Ind., Donald and Audrey Greenhill of Tinley Park, Thomas and Solveig Greenhill of Lockport, Kenneth and Luisa Greenhill and Kevin and Cynthia Greenhill, all of Tinley Park; one daughter and son-in-law, Kimberly and Jeff Hannah of Oak Lawn; two sisters, Madeline McNeal and Dolores Masters, both of Chicago; one brother, Donald Greenhill of Chicago; 16 grandchildren

and one great-grandchild; and many nieces and nephews. Deceased are one son, John S. Greenhill III; and two brothers, Thomas and Raymond.
