Joseph A. Angelo, 84, of Kankakee, passed away Monday (Oct. 27, 2014) at Edward Hospital in Naperville.

He was born Feb. 28, 1930, in Gary, Ind., the son of Anthony and Catherine Orlando Angelo. Joseph married Lois Mulzon on May 9, 1959. They had been married for 55 years.

Mr. Angelo was a U.S. Army Korean War veteran, artillery, from 1950 to 1953. He loved to cook and was a handyman.

After 45 years, he retired from Sears in 1994, where he was a display manager in the local store. He attended St. Joseph Catholic Church in Bradley for 15 years and St. Teresa Catholic Church in Kankakee for the past 35 years.

Surviving are his wife, of Kankakee; three sons, Michael and Heidi Angelo, of Aurora, Anthony and Anne Angelo, of Homer Glen, and Joseph K. and Shelly Angelo, of Chandler, Ariz.; one brother, Phillip and Angie Angelo, of Merrillville, Ind.; and four grandchildren, Emily Angelo, J.J. Angelo, Mackenzie Angelo and Joey Angelo.
