Joseph S. Feth, age 80, of Bourbonnais passed away Thursday, February 5, 2026 at the Illinois Veterans Home at Manteno. He was born November 13, 1945 in Pittsburgh, PA, the son of Joseph B. & Dorothy (Hutchins) Feth. Joseph married LaVerne Getz on September 3, 1966 in Pittsburgh, PA. Joseph was the former President of St. Mary's Hospital, CEO of Servant Cor and Provena Health, and president of People Etc. He was a graduate of Duquesne University with a B.S., Pacific Lutheran University with an M.B.A in Business, and Washington University in St. Louis with an M.S. in Healthcare. Joseph was a founding member and former member of the Board of Directors of First Trust Bank. Above all, he enjoyed his work. He was a veteran of the United States Air Force having served from 1967-1971.

Surviving are his wife of 59 years, LaVerne Feth of Bourbonnais; two daughters, Joey Lee & Jaime McMullen of Bourbonnais and Heidi & James McCabe of Bourbonnais; two sisters, Karen Collins of Nashville, TN and Chris & Rich Miller of Little River, SC; one brother, Daniel & Lynnda Feth of Lewes, DE; eleven grandchildren; and three great-grandchildren. Joseph is preceded in death by his parents and one son, Scott Feth.
