



Joseph Gianotti

May 1, 1918 - June 19, 2009

Joseph C. Gianotti, 91, of Limestone, passed away peacefully on Friday (June 19, 2009) at Provena St. Mary's Hospital, Kankakee, after a brief illness.

Visitation will be from 2 p.m. to 8 p.m. Tuesday at the Clancy-Gernon-Hertz Funeral Home, west Kankakee. A funeral Mass will be celebrated at 10 a.m. Wednesday at St. Rose of Lima Catholic Church, Kankakee. Burial will follow at Mount Calvary Cemetery. In lieu of flowers, donations may be made to Bishop McNamara Catholic High School, St. Rose of Lima Catholic Church, St. Mary's Catholic Church, Reddick, or to the donor's choice. He was born May 1, 1918, in East Brooklyn, the son of Frank and Minnie Viviani Gianotti, and raised in Reddick. He married Margaret Cofield Oct. 26, 1940, in Kankakee. His career as an accountant and CPA spanned 43 years, retiring from Topping, Gianotti, Payne, Groskreutz and Schmidt in 1983. He used his talents providing financial guidance to such organizations as The Hundred Club of Kankakee County, the Diocese of Joliet, the United Way, St. Rose of Lima Catholic Church, Catholic Chairities, and countless other groups. He was a 1935 graduate of Reddick High School and a 1939 graduate of the University of Illinois at Champaign. He played and coached for the Westside Boosters and was a member of the IHSA Hall of Fame as a friend of basketball. He was a 3rd and 4th Degree member of the Knights of Columbus. Surviving are two sons and daughters-in-law, Francis and Carolyn Gianotti of Kankakee, John and Darlene Gianotti of Orland Park; four daughters and three sons-in-law, Joanne and William Farlander of Hanapepe,

Hawaii, Mary and Roger Kopac of Asheville, N.C., Sue and Phil Hodak of Kankakee, Rosanne Gianotti and friend, Gary Regas of Limestone; nephew, Dr. Joseph and Mrs. Kathleen Meisenbach; great-nephew, Jonathan Meisenbach; and special friend, Nancy Chisum. Mr. Gianotti was preceded in death by his parents; his wife, Margaret (1983); and one sister, Mary Meisenbach. He was blessed with 10 grandchildren, four great-grandchildren, with anticipation of his fifth.
