Joseph Kubick -- Kankakee Joseph "Joe" Kubick, 83, of Kankakee, died Saturday (Dec. 24, 2005) at ManorCare Health Services. Visitation will be from 4-8 p.m. Wednesday at the Clancy-Gernon Funeral Home, Bourbonnais. A funeral Mass will be celebrated at 10 a.m. Thursday at St. Patrick's Catholic Church, where he was a member. Interment will be in All Saints Mausoleum, Bourbonnais. Memorials may be made to the American Cancer Society or to the Arthritis Foundation. Mr. Kubick was the former president of Kankakee Sheet Metal Works Inc. until selling the business to his partner in 1972. He received his real estate license in 1973 and was affiliated with various offices until his retirement from Roy Realty and Appraisals in 1988. He was born Dec. 11, 1922, in Kankakee, the son of Ignatz and Bernadette Slovikoski Kubick. He was a graduate of Kankakee High School. He served in the U.S. Navy from 1942-46 as an aviation metalsmith, first class, and was a 60-year member of the Kankakee American Legion Post 85. He was also a member of the Knights of Columbus and the Holy Name Society at St. Patrick's Catholic Church. He was a fan of the Chicago Cubs and Bears and had enjoyed bowling in his younger years. Surviving are his wife, the former Carol L. Stewart, whom he married Aug. 16, 1947 at St. Patrick's Catholic Church, Kankakee; one daughter and son-in-law, Patricia and Kevin Adame of Cary, N.C.; two sons and daughters-in-law, Gregory and Susan Kubick of Kankakee, Kerry and Donna Kubick of Lompoc, Calif.; six grandchildren, Erin (Robert) White, Kelly Kubick, Michelle Maycen, Bradley Kubick, Margaret and

Diane Kubick; three stepgrandchildren, Jodi (Camerino) Palmerin, Ryan and Nathan Adame; and one stepgreat-granddaughter, Marissa Palmerin. Deceased are his parents and one sister and brother-in-law, Therese and John Laws.
