



## **Sr. Julia Rose Moriarty SSCM**

December 23, 1919 - July 24, 2014

Sister Julia Rose Moriarty, SSCM, 94 of Kankakee died Thursday, July 24, 2014 at Presence Our Lady of Victory in Bourbonnais. She was born December 23, 1919 in Rockwell City, Iowa; the daughter of Edmund and Rosa (nee Smith) Moriarty in Rockwell City, Iowa. Sister attended Rockwell City High School in Iowa, graduating in 1937. She received her Bachelor's in Nursing from Marquette University College of Nursing in Milwaukee, Wisconsin in 1955 and her Masters in Administration from Catholic Union of America in Washington, DC in 1960. She also received her CPE Certificate from Midway and Mounds Park Hospital in 1975.

From 1942 to 1973, Sister Julia devoted her life to the medical field as an Administrator, Nurse and Director of Nursing at Mercy School of Nursing and Parkland Junior College in Champaign, Illinois. In 1972, she served in ministry as Vice President of Patient Care at Mercy Community. In 1973, Sister completed education in Clinical Pastoral Ministry and began in the Pastoral Care Department at St. Mary's Hospital in Kankakee, Illinois. 1978 to 1981 she lived in Silver Spring, MD and ministered as Pastoral Care Chaplain for St. John the Baptist School and later as Chaplain at Georgetown University in Washington, DC. In 1981 she became Director of Pastoral Ministry at Our Lady of Victory Nursing Home. From 1985 to 1993, she lived in Champaign, serving in various capacities. In 1994, she enjoyed a year of missionary work with our sisters in Argentina, sharing her knowledge and experience in Pastoral Care, Nursing and caring for the retired, infirmed and poor in the

region. From 1995 to 2011, she volunteered at Covenant Medical Center (nee Mercy Community Hospital) as receptionist. In 2011, she relocated to St. Mary Community in Kankakee where she currently resides. Sister enjoys photography, gardening and socializing with her friends.

She is survived by 11 nephews, 12 nieces and several great nieces and nephews.

Sr. Julia was preceded in death by her parents, 2 sisters, Bernadette Rees and Mary Ptistick; 7 brothers-Daniel, John, Fred, Paul, Bernard, Richard, and Edward Moriarity.

Visitation will be from 4 PM-7 PM Sunday at Presence St. Mary's Hospital Chapel, Kankakee, where a funeral mass will be held at 10 AM Monday. Burial will follow at St. Mary's Cemetery in Beaverville, Illinois.
