Kenneth A. Netzel, 89, of Bourbonnais, died Saturday (Oct. 25, 2008) at his home. Visitation will be from 4 p.m. to 8 p.m. Monday at the Clancy-Gernon Funeral Home, Bourbonnais. A funeral Mass will be celebrated at 11 a.m. Tuesday at St. Patrick Catholic Church, Kankakee, where he was a member. Entombment will be in All Saints Cemetery, Bourbonnais.
