As we prepare to give you your final send-off today and tomorrow, it still hasn't sunken in that you're not here anymore. Me and Teresa were just talking about it late last night... we both agreed that it only feels like you're out of town and will be back in a few weeks, even though we both logically know the reality of it all - which will become painfully clear in a couple of hours when we see you again. That is why I've decided to write this now - rather than later - while this false reality in my head still barely exists...

I always loved your unique sense of humor - it truly was one-of-a-kind in every way. When we were kids, I always loved to make you laugh (ah, that infectious laugh...) and it gives me a ton of comfort to know that those humorous memories stayed with you until the end. I know that they did because of the countless times you've reminisced on them at family gatherings over the years and how much your face would instantly light up upon mentioning them. You would laugh just as hard and loud every time, as if those things only happened the day before.

I remember being overjoyed when, at 15 years old, I became an uncle for the first time. For a long time afterwards, Dylan felt more like a little brother to me than anything else, in the way that me and him used to chase each other around the house and even argue like immature brothers often do.
