Kurt A. Ogg, age 81, of Bourbonnais passed away Tuesday, July 30, 2024 at Ascension St. Mary's Hospital Emergency Room in Kankakee. He was born November 14, 1942 in Streator, the son of J. Merlin & Marjory (Kelch) Ogg. Kurt married Darlene Sanquist on October 13, 1962 at St. Patrick Catholic Church in Kankakee.

Kurt was a graduate of Dwight High School and Rutgers University. He was an accountant at CSL Behring LLC, retiring after 43 years of service. He was a board chairperson at Fieldstone Credit Union. Kurt volunteered at St. Mary's Hospital. He had been a runner. Kurt enjoyed researching genealogy, doing puzzles (Sudoku), and loved reading.

He was a parishioner of Maternity B.V.M. Catholic Church in Bourbonnais.

Surviving are his wife of 61 years, Darlene Ogg of Bourbonnais; two daughters and two sons-in-law, Teresa & Craig Culver of Bourbonnais and Beth & Tom Davis of Muskego, WI; two sisters, Carol Sobotta of Alton and Pamela & Dale Coughlin of Dwight; one brother, William Ogg of Dwight; four grandchildren, Jason (Shannon) Culver, Molly (Christopher) Roberts, Melanie Davis, and Julia Davis; and one great grandchild, Isabel Roberts. 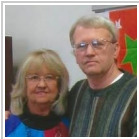

I didn’t forget you making peanut butter cookies for a snack. I’ll never forget participating in the Jaycee’s Junior Olympics and Kurt was a Jaycee at that time. Mind you that I was not a graceful, but a clumsy girl. I remember trying high jump a few times and I skinned my shins repeatedly. I tried so hard to accomplish the high jump but was unsuccessful. Kurt called my parent’s home and told my Dad that I tried hard to accomplish the high jump and he was checking on me because I had skinned my shins so badly. All the while Kurt was going to Rutgers University in the evening after working all day and eventually earned his Accounting Degree. His parents and brother came to town to celebrate his graduation with Darlene and the girls. Not too long after he graduated they announced that their family was moving back to Illinois.
