Visitation for LaVerne Hunt, 91, of Franklin, Ky., formerly of St. Anne, will be from 4-8 p.m. Sunday, with a 7 p.m. Masonic service, at the Clancy-Gernon-Houk Funeral Home, St. Anne. One brother-in-law, Willard Bossert, is deceased. Mr. Hunt was a member of the Masonic Lodge, Scottish Rite and White Shrine. He was a church sponsor for Boy Scout Troop 316 and auditor for Papineau Township. He enjoyed
