Visitation for Leo M. Ciaccio, 57, of Bourbonnais, will be from 4 p.m. to 8 p.m. Thursday at the Clancy-Gernon Funeral Home in Bourbonnais. A funeral Mass will be celebrated at 11 a.m. Friday at Maternity BVM Catholic Church, Bourbonnais.

Burial will be in All Saints Cemetery, Bourbonnais. In lieu of flowers, memorials may be made to the family wishes. He passed away Monday (Feb. 6, 2012).

Mr. Ciaccio always worked in the family business. He was currently manager of Aspen Ridge Golf Course and was formerly at Fifty-Fore Smack and Snak. He was born April 13, 1954, in Kankakee, the son of Leo J. and Barbara M. Leone Ciaccio. He was a graduate of Bishop McNamara High School, class of 1972. He loved gardening and cooking. He was famous for his homemade Italian bread.

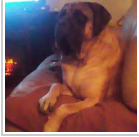

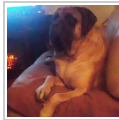
