Leo C. Kibbons, 69, of Okeechobee, Fla., formerly of Kankakee, died Wednesday (July 6, 2005) at the Veterans Administration Hospital in West Palm Beach, Fla. A motor procession to Abraham Lincoln National Cemetery, Elwood, will leave at 9:15 a.m. Tuesday from the Clancy-Gernon Funeral Home, Bourbonnais, for the 10 a.m. graveside service. Memorials may be made to St. Jude Childrens Research Hospital. Mr. Kibbons was a pipefitter at the Joliet Army Ammunition Plant and a bar owner for 15 years in Momence and Grant Park. He was born Feb. 3, 1936, in Kankakee, the son of Leo D. and Alma Kibbons. He served in the U.S. Marines during the Korean Conflict and was a member of the Momence VFW Post 7535. He was a member of the Momence Anchor Club, the Aroma Park Boat Club and the Kankakee Valley Boat Club. He loved to fish. Surviving are his wife, the former Clarissa M. 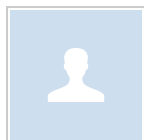

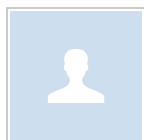

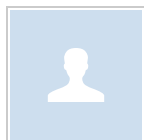
