Leopold Zullo -- Kankakee Visitation for Leopold Paul Zullo, 84, of Marrero, La., formerly of Kankakee, will be from 4-8 p.m. Friday at the Clancy-Gernon Funeral Home, Bourbonnais. A funeral Mass will be celebrated at 10 a.m. Saturday at Maternity BVM Catholic Church, Bourbonnais. Burial will be in Mt. Calvary Cemetery, Kankakee. He died Friday (Feb. 24, 2006) in Marrero after having Alzheimer's for 12 years. Mr. Zullo retired from General Foods Gaines Plant in Kankakee after 20 years of service. He had also worked as a yardman for the Big Four Railroad; in his father's shoe repair shop, a craft he practiced for 50 years; and had a home repair and remodeling business. He was born in Kankakee, the son of Gabriel and Bridgette Tofari Zullo. He had lived in Kankakee all his life until moving to New Orleans in 1994 to live with his son. He was a graduate of St. Patrick's High School and was a star halfback on the football team. He was a member of St. Patrick's Catholic Church, Kankakee, where he served on the altar, ushered for many years and participated in the church's Boy Scout Troop. He was a 4th Degree lifetime member of the Knights of Columbus. He served in the U.S. Army during World War II with the 30th Infantry Division through several European Campaigns. He was awarded the Purple Heart, the Combat Infantryman Badge and the European Theater Ribbon with four bronze stars. He enjoyed dancing with the Bachelor and Bachelorettes Square Dance Group and his friend, Dorothy Leahy. Surviving are two sons and daughters-in-law, Michael and Connie Zullo of Bourbonnais, David and Lisa Zullo of New Orleans; one daughter and son-

in-law, Jane and Dan Fetzner of Winter Springs, Fla.; two brothers and two sisters, Leo and Rudy and Elvira and Viola of Bourbonnais and Kankakee; 14 grandchildren and 12 great-grandchildren; and many nieces and nephews. Deceased are his wife, Venita Brosseau Zullo; three sons, Donald, Richard and Kenneth; one brother, Angelo in World War II; and three sisters, Josephine, Ida and Genevieve.
