Lloyd Francoeur -- Bourbonnais Visitation for Lloyd J. Francoeur, 85, of Bourbonnais, will be from 5 p.m. to 8 p.m. Monday at Clancy-Gernon Funeral Home, Bourbonnais, where funeral services will be held at 11 a.m. Tuesday. He died Thursday (Jan. 17, 2008) at Provena St. Mary's Hospital. Mr. Francoeur was retired from Roper Corp., Kankakee Division, after 42 years of service. He was born Oct. 28, 1922, in Kankakee, the son of Edward and Victorine Pommier Francoeur. He served during World War II in the U.S. Army Air Corps in the South Pacific. He enjoyed golfing and sports of all kinds.
