Lucille C. Granger, 80, a resident of Bradley Royale Health Care Center for 14 years, died Tuesday (Jan. 25, 2005) in the emergency room at Provena St. Mary's Hospital, Kankakee. Visitation will be from 4-8 p.m. Thursday at the Clancy-Gernon Funeral Home in Bourbonnais. A funeral Mass will be celebrated at 10 a.m. Friday at St. Joseph Catholic Church, Bradley. Burial will be in Mt. Calvary Cemetery, Kankakee. Memorials may be made to St. Joseph Grade School. Mrs. Granger worked at the Joliet Arsenal Shell Plant during the war. She was born Feb. 25, 1924, in Kankakee, the daughter of Leon and Ethel Hays Bertrand. Her parents are deceased. Her husband, Edgar Granger, whom she married May 10, 1943 at St. Rose of Lima Catholic Church, died June 27, 2001.
