He was a member of St. Patrick's Catholic Church, the church choir, and a longtime member of the Knights of Columbus. He was also a member of the Kankakee VFW Post 2857 and the Something Special Singers of Kankakee. He enjoyed spoiling his four granddaughters and loved family get-togethers.
