



## Mae Ziemer

September 21, 1923 - February 15, 2005

Visitation for Mae I. Ziemer, 81, of Bourbonnais, will be from 4-8 p.m. today at the Clancy-Gernon-Hertz Funeral Home, West Kankakee, and from 9 a.m. Friday at Our Savior Lutheran Church, Bradley, until the 10 a.m. services. She died Tuesday (Feb. 15, 2005) at Provena Our Lady of Victory Nursing Home, Bourbonnais. Mrs. Ziemer started working at Kankakee Roper in the shell plant during the early years of World War II. She later was timekeeper for 17 years at Bradley Roper, retiring in 1983. She was born Sept. 21, 1923, in Abbotsford, Wis., the daughter of Einar and Josephine Schommer Olson. Surviving are her husband, Frederick B. Ziemer, of Bourbonnais, whom she married Nov. 20, 1943, in Colorado Springs, Colo.; two sons and daughters-in-law, Frederick H. and Ann Ziemer of Severn, Md., William and Dottie Ziemer of Bourbonnais; one daughter, Linda Davison of Bourbonnais; two sisters and brothers-in-law, Vernice and Bert Perry of Eagle River, Wis., Shirley and Eldon Overright of Bradley; six grandchildren and six great-grandchildren. One son, baby Ziemer who was a twin of Frederick, died at birth and is buried in Galveston, Texas; one son-in-law, Conrad Davison; and one brother, Ivan Olson, are deceased. Mrs. Ziemer was a member of Our Savior Lutheran Church, Bradley, where she was past president of the church guild. She was also past president of Kankakee American Legion Post 85 Auxiliary.
