Maizie S. Duncan, 88 of Bourbonnais died Tuesday, July 7, 2009 at Riverside Medical Center. She was born March 20, 1921 in Cresco, Iowa the daughter of Walter L. and Clara H. Grinde Johnson. Her first husband, Everett W. Seath and her second husband, Angelo Duncan, both preceded her in death. She is a 1947 graduate of Luther College in Decorah, Iowa. In 1976 she earned a Masters Degree in Special Education from University of Utah. Mrs. Duncan was a retired school teacher; she taught English, Music, and Special Education. She served in the U.S. Navy from 1943-1945 during WW II. She was a member of the W.A.V.E.S. where she was a Specialist 2nd Class. Mrs. Duncan was a member of Our Savior Lutheran Church in Bradley. She was a musician and enjoyed playing the piano, violin, and flute. She also taught music. Surviving are two sons, Larry B. and Juanita Seath of Roy, Utah, Steven W. Seath of Santa Cruz, California; two daughters, Ingri Sparling of Santa Rosa, California, Cheryl E. Seath and Lynn Oliver of Bishop, California; one sister, Jean Jones of Davenport, Iowa; and two grandchildren. Mrs. Duncan has donated her body to science. A memorial service will be held 3:30 PM Sunday, July 12, 2009 at the Illinois Veterans Home in Manteno. Rev. Patti Heath will officiate.
