Marguerite Walsh -- Bourbonnais Marguerite R. Walsh, 89, of Bourbonnais, died Saturday (Jan. 12, 2008) at the Miller Center in Kankakee. Visitation will be from 4 p.m. to 8 p.m. Tuesday at the Clancy-Gernon Funeral Home in Bourbonnais. A funeral Mass will be celebrated at 10 a.m. Wednesday at Maternity BVM Catholic Church, Bourbonnais, where she was a member. The Rev. Richard Pighini will officiate. She had been a den mother for Cub Scouts and a room mother. She enjoyed sewing.
