Marion I. Kehrt, 91, of Bourbonnais, died Tuesday (Feb. 28, 2012) at the University of Chicago. Visitation will be from 5 p.m. to 8 p.m. Thursday at the Clancy-Gernon Funeral Home, Bourbonnais. A funeral Mass will be celebrated at 11 a.m. Friday at Maternity BVM Catholic Church, Bourbonnais. The Rev. Jason Nesbit will officiate.

Burial will be in Mount Olivet Cemetery, Wilmington. Memorials may be made to the American Heart Association.

Mrs. Kehrt was a teacher for 32 years in the Kempton/Cabery schools from 1958 to 1985. She then taught at Tri-Point School in Cullom. She was born Dec. 8, 1920, in Coal City, the daughter of John and Helen Flynn Downing. Her husband, Stanley Kehrt, whom she married in 1942 at Assumption Catholic Church in Coal City, preceded her in death in 1986.

Surviving are one son and daughter-in-law, Richard Francis and Linda Kehrt, of Clear Lake, Iowa; one daughter and son-in-law, Sandra and Gordon Stuky, of Kankakee; five grandchildren, Anita (Tim) Teter, Laura (Don) Cullotta, Chad (Roxanne) Kehrt, Noel (Stacy) Kehrt and Sara (Bruce) Oberle; eight great-grandchildren, Adam and Makenzie Teter, Calogero and Alessandra Cullotta, Mara and Ellen Kehrt and Emerson and Isaac Oberle; and three stepgreat-grandchildren, Jill (Nick) Kerr, and Josh and Jake Oehlerking.

She was preceded in death by her parents; one brother, Doyle Downing; and three sisters, Ruth Smith, Therese Downing and Edna Delmastro.
