Marjorie Hult moved with her family from Chicago to Kankakee in 1951, where her husband Einar later opened Hult Floor Covering, which is currently operated as Hult Interior Design. Prior to moving to Kankakee, Marjorie was a data processing operator. While her children were growing up, she was active in many community organizations, including the Jaycee Wives, Riverside Twig, Girl Scouts, Brownies, Cub Scouts, and PTA. For over 40 years, she served as an election judge in Kankakee. She also had been a member of the Human Rights Committee at Shapiro Developmental Center for over a decade. At age 77, she became an active member of Riverside Health and Fitness Center, regularly working out four days a week while inspiring others with their workout programs. Marjorie was also a member of Weight Watchers and was extremely proud of achieving her weight goal a few weeks ago. She will be fondly remembered by friends and family for her infectious smile, staunch opinions, determination and genuine interest and concern for others. Surviving are her two daughters, Terri Hult and special friend Earle Overby of Kankakee, Marjorie Milone and husband Bruce Milone of Bourbonnais; two sons, Dr. Frederick Hult of

McHenry and Capt. Stephen Hult of St. Louis, Mo.; four grandchildren, Erin and Tyler Milone, Victoria and Andrew Hult; one brother-in-law and sister-in-law, Eric and Millie Hult of Columbus, Ind.; and numerous nieces and nephews. She was preceded in death by her husband, Einar Hult, whom she married Aug. 21, 1948, in Chicago. He died April 13, 2007. Also deceased are her parents, Theresa and Conrad Peto; two sisters and one brother.
