Mark Carl "Cowboy" Rosengarten, age 67, of Beaverville passed away Wednesday, January 9, 2019 at his home. He was born July 1, 1951 in Lima, OH, the son of Raymond & Margaret (Huelskamp) Rosengarten. Mark married Donna Silcox at the Kankakee County Courthouse on March 24, 2000.

Mark worked for the Laborers Local 751 at various businesses including, Triangle Construction, Azzarelli Construction Company, and Iroquois Paving Corporation. He had previously worked with Indiana Laborers as well. Mark loved to ride horses. He liked country western music and loved to dance. He was of the Catholic faith.

Mark was a veteran of the United States Army where he served as a Military Policeman in both Vietnam and Korea for most of his tour.

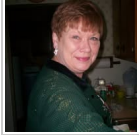
