Mary Ellen Burnett, 78, of Kankakee, died Thursday (Jan. 13, 2005) at Riverside Medical Center. Visitation will be from 2-5 p.m. Sunday at the Clancy-Gernon Funeral Home in Bourbonnais, and from 10 a.m. Monday at the First Presbyterian Church in Kankakee, until the 11 a.m. services. Rev. Alan Good will officiate. Burial will be in All Saints Cemetery, Bourbonnais. Memorials may be made to Riverside Medical Center Foundation, 350 N. Wall St., Kankakee, IL 60901. Mrs. Burnett was a registered nurse and homemaker. She was also a volunteer for the American Red Cross. She was born Jan. 14, 1926, in St. Charles, Mo., the daughter of Harry and Ellen Hollrah Hoelscher. Her parents are deceased. Her husband, Dr. John C. Burnett, whom she married Aug. 16, 1947, in Chicago, died Jan. 14, 1998. Surviving are two sons and daughters-in-law, Dr. John C. Jr. and Linda LaBeau Burnett of Rochester, Minn., Henry Guy "Harry" and Helena Burnett of New York, N.Y.; one daughter, Mary Elise Burnett of Kankakee; and four grandchildren, John Samuel (Maya) Burnett, Lesley Burnett, Henry Guy Burnett Jr. and Renata Burnett. Three brothers, Harry, James and Thomas Hoelscher, are deceased. She was a graduate of Lindenwood College, St. Charles, Mo., and Lutheran General Hospital School of Nursing, St. Louis, Mo. Mrs. Burnett was a member of the First Presbyterian Church in Kankakee, where she was a deacon. She was a member of the Kankakee Kultivators; the Crusaders; the Culver Mothers Association, where she was a former board member; and the Kankakee County Medical Auxiliary, where she was a former

president.
