



Michael A. Setticasi

September 13, 1929 - March 27, 2013

Visitation for Michael A. Setticasi, 83, of Kankakee, will be from 4 p.m. to 7 p.m. Monday at the Clancy-Gernon-Hertz Funeral Home, west Kankakee, where funeral services will be held at 10 a.m. Tuesday. Deacon Patrick Skelly will officiate. Burial will be in Mount Calvary Cemetery, Kankakee. Memorials may be made to the family wishes. He died Wednesday (March 27, 2013) at Presence St. Mary's Hospital in Kankakee. Mr. Setticasi was a retired CPA. He was born Sept. 13, 1929, in Kankakee, the son of Baldasurri and Rose Accurso Setticasi. His wife, the former Marlene Rittmanic, whom he married May 14, 1955, at St. Joseph Catholic Church in Bradley, died Oct. 30, 1987. He served in the U.S. Army during the Korean War. He received the Purple Heart, Korean Service Medal, two Bronze Stars, United Nations Medal and the National Defense Service Medal. He was a member of St. Teresa Catholic Church in Kankakee, Kankakee VFW Post 2857, Aroma Park American Legion Post 1019, Knights of Columbus 745, and a longtime member of the Sons of Italy. Surviving are two sons and one daughter-in-law, Michael C. Setticasi, of Kankakee, and Joe and Connie Setticasi, of Martinton; four daughters and three sons-in-law, Theresa Setticasi, of Arlington, Texas, Marilyn Setticasi and Doug Visgrove, of Dallas, Texas, Charlene and Rick Morse, of Grand Prairie, Texas, and Rose and Roger Mayer, of Stratford, Conn.; 11 grandchildren and eight great-grandchildren. He was preceded in death by his parents; one brother, Joseph Setticasi; and one great-grandson. He had a deep passion for baseball, from Little League through college, and

played for the Army baseball team until he was wounded in Korea. He went to Loras Catholic College. He was an amateur boxer and pool shark during his college years. He coached Little League baseball in Kankakee. He enjoyed spending time with his children and their friends. He was a loving husband, father, grandfather and great-grandfather.
