Visitation for Mildred A. Perron, 92, of Bradley, will be from 9 a.m. Monday until the 10 a.m. services at the Clancy-Gernon-Hertz Funeral Home, West Kankakee. Rev. Dennis Settles will officiate. Burial will be in Mt. Calvary Cemetery, Kankakee. Memorials may be made for Masses at St. Martin of Tours Catholic Church, where she was a member; or to Birthright of Kankakee. She died Tuesday (March 29, 2005) at Bradley Royale Health Care Center. Mrs. Perron worked for the Wisconsin State Employment Service for 20 years and then taught at Marycrest College as an economics professor for 10 years. She was born May 1, 1912 in Hartford, Wis. Her husband, Ray Perron, whom she married in 1939, died in 1989. Surviving are one daughter, Susan Berkholtz of Providence, R.I.; and three grandsons, John J. and Greg Perron and John Berkholtz. One son, Jack Perron, is deceased. She graduated from the University of Wisconsin with a bachelor of arts degree in economics. Mrs. Perron was a member of Zonta, St. Martin's CCW, Salvation Army Creative Writers Club and the Book Review Club.
