Visitation for Milton R. DeYoung, 87, of Kankakee, will be from 10 a.m. Saturday until the noon funeral service at Calvary Bible Church in Bourbonnais, where he was a member. The Rev. Delbert Belcher will officiate.

Mr. DeYoung was a retired Realtor and farmer. He had worked at Coldwell Banker. He was born Dec. 2, 1925, in St. Anne, the son of Arthur and Grace Vrolyk DeYoung. His wife, the former Marjorie K. Boomsma, whom he married July 7, 1948, in Wichert, died Oct. 23, 2012. He served in the U.S. Army during World War II in Japan. He was a member of the first board of the Kankakee Youth for Christ. The love of his life was his wife of 64 years, together they faithfully served Gideons International for more than 40 years. He was always eager to share his love for Jesus Christ to anyone that would listen.
