Mrs. Pelletier was a registered nurse for two private doctors at Milwaukee County Hospital in Wisconsin prior to moving to the Bourbonnais area. She was born Dec. 1, 1927, in Ozaukee County, Wis., the daughter of Dominic and Ferreole Dandlanger Heinen. Her husband, Albert P. Pelletier, whom she married Sept. 19, 1959, in Fredonia, Wis., died Oct. 21, 2003. She was a volunteer for Meals on Wheels through Riverside Medical Center for more than 25 years and was very active in numerous other charitable organizations and activities in the area. She was a member of and held various offices at Maternity BVM Credit Union and Maternity BVM Council of Catholic Women, named Woman of the Year, was a member of the Maternity BVM Parents Club and ran the KeenAgers program for senior citizens at Maternity BVM Parish. Surviving are two sons and one daughter-in-law, George A. Pelletier of Spokane, Wash., Paul and Nina Pelletier of Kankakee; three daughters and sons-in-law, Mary and Brad Seavoy of Chicago, Ann and Greg Billadeau of Colorado; Joan and Jim Howell of Bloomington; seven grandchildren; and one brother and sister-

in-law, Gerald "Bud" and Maxcine Heinen of Port Washington, Wis.
