Norman R. "Dewey" DuMontelle, age 91, of Herscher passed away Saturday, January 15, 2022 at his home. He was born August 18, 1930 in Papineau, the son of Wesley & Blanche (Sizemore) DuMontelle. Dewey married Lucille Clement on October 21, 1951 in St. Anne. She preceded him in death on April 19, 2000.

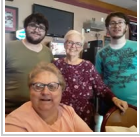

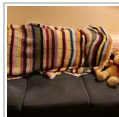
