She died Monday (March 31, 2008) at the Miller Center, from cancer. Mrs. Waggoner had been a social worker for the Illinois Department of Children and Family Services in Kankakee and Springfield. She was born July 13, 1923, in Springfield, the daughter of Archibald and Olivia B. Hudson Reid. Her first husband, John Mahoney, whom she married in 1948, died in 1969. She then married William Waggoner in 1976. He died in 1992. She received a Bachelor of Science degree from Illinois College and did graduate studies at Washington University and Governors State University. She was a member of the rosary prayer group at St. Martin's Church; the Kankakee Art League; the Civil War Symposium, the Daughters of the American Revolution, OUTRAGE, CASA, and Stargazers. She was a volunteer at the Kankakee County Museum and the Kankakee Public Library. She enjoyed painting and quilting. Surviving are one son and two daughters-in-law, Michael and Teresa Mahoney of Kankakee, MaryAnn Mahoney Schobinger of Crystal Lake; one

daughter and son-in-law, Olivia Ann and Vasile Bouleanu of Skokie; and 11 grandchildren. Deceased are one son, Jay Mahoney; one brother, retired Navy Capt. Andrew Reid; and one sister, Mary Frances Harrison.
