Ora Rice -- Bradley Visitation for Ora L. Homberg Rice, 96, of Bradley, will be from 4-8 p.m. today at the Clancy-Gernon-Hertz Funeral Home, west Kankakee, where services will be held at 11 a.m. Tuesday. She died Friday (April 7, 2006) at Bradley Royale Health Care Center. Mrs. Rice retired after 22 1/2 years as a color analyst for Mobil Chemical Company. She was born June 30, 1909, in Galatia, the daughter of Elmer C. and Ethel M. Karnes Knight. Her first husband, Louis J. Homberg, whom she married Aug. 12, 1932, in Morganfield, Ky., died Jan. 16, 1958. Her second husband, Harold L. Rice, whom she married June 7, 1969, at Virden, died Aug. 16, 2001. She did volunteer work with RSVP for St. Mary's Hospital. She was a 70-year member of Central Christian Church, Bourbonnais. She had been a Sunday school teacher, a Diaconate and had served on several church committees. She had also been a Cub Scout den mother.
