Pam Gerts' years long battle with pulmonary fibrosis came to an end on September 16, 2021, when she died with family at her side.

Pam was born and raised in Chicago, a proud "South Sider" and a Chicago White Sox fan.

She came to Kankakee in 1977 with her husband, Ron. People in the county still recognized her as the Clerk of the Jury Commission in the 1990's. She was a proud "Bubbe" (Yiddish for grandmother) of twin grandchildren. She exercised her love of photography to take hundreds of photos of the grandkids. In retirement for nine years, she was fortunate to live near and be involved in the lives of her children and grandchildren almost every day.
