Paul John went home to God, his beloved wife, Suzanne, and his “Ma and Pa on Tuesday, March 5, 2019 at Amita St. Mary’s Hospital in Kankakee. Born in Chicago, August 22, 1933, Paul was the second son of Michael & Mary (McNamara) Pruchnicki.

The Pruchnicki family was part of Vistaiton parish, “the largest Irish American Parish on the planet” as Paul animatedly described it.

Paul received his early schooling with the Dominican Order of Sisters, whom he remembered with affection. In high school where he was educated by the Jesuits, he gained recognition and honors on the debate team. In sports, he ran track. He was a close enthusiast and follower of boxing. After graduation, Paul experienced a call to the priesthood and subsequently entered an extensive academic and religious preparation as a Jesuit seminarian. A final discernment led him to a teaching career as a lay person.

He taught high school English in various schools in Chicago, including several years as an educator at Marmion Military Academy. While completing his years in English at Bishop McNamara High School in Kankakee, he met Suzanne Smith Granzow, the high school’s Art teacher. They married in 1981. Suzanne preceded him in death on August 28, 2017.

Thereafter, he became a partner with his wife, Suzanne and her sister, Elmira Smith Wilkey in The Bronte Press (a limited editions press founded by Suzanne and Elmira in 1977), at their Manteno facility.

Though history and travel were Paul John's avocations, he embraced being a grandparent and great-grandparent, and became a favorite uncle. He touched the lives of many people in all walks of life through his affirming and caring nature.

Surviving are one step-son, Harry III & Lynn Granzow of Sioux City, IA; one step-daughter, Charlotte (Granzow) & Alan Caron of Port Orchard, WA; five grandchildren, Edward Caron, Lydia Caron, Alexander Granzow, Austin Granzow, Elizabeth (Granzow) Crow; one sister, Helen (Pruchnicki) & William Peterson; one brother and three sisters-in-law, Daniel & Joan (Callahan) Prunicki, Carol Lynn Pruchnicki, and Mary Elmira Smith Wilkey; and nieces and nephews, Dr. Michael Pruchnicki, Mary Ann Picone, Mary Ellen Lewandowski, Patrick & Mary Ann Peterson, Kathleen Peterson, John & Pamela Peterson, Daniel "Danny" Peterson, Helen Pruchnicki Peterson, Bridget Prunicki, Andrew & Mary Prunicki, Dr. Julia & Shawn Steinke, Claire & Eric Duncan, Anthony Wilkey, Eric Wilkey, Martin Wilkey, Barry Wilkey, Tad Wilkey, and Jeremy Wilkey.
