The chats with Uncle Paul were particularly fun as he would always laugh about something with that infectious laugh he was so well known for. He was treated like the baby, by my Mom and he was very special and dear to her.

Of the times I actually got to spend with Uncle Paul in Illinois, one of them is a stand out, and it was not quite as humorous as those phone chats arranged by my Mom (at least it seemed that way for Uncle Paul). As it was, Brian Campbell felt that it was important, that since I was 10 years old like him, that it was high time for us, at our advanced age, to pay a call on the nearby train station. Well, it wasn't exactly "Grand Central," (more like a Chicago-Land stockyard kind of place). It seemed cool enough though.

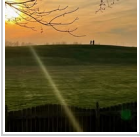
Upon arrival, some weirdo hobo dude, who must have moonlighted as a concierge somewhere, showed us around some of the rail cars, and he was particularly set on, showing us a rail car with a big ole dead Chicago-Land hog in it. Not sure, if the hobo was intimating something at that point, but that is when I believe that Brian, saved my life (though that is not the way Uncle Paul saw it later) - I digress. After the hog stop, Brian told me, that it was a lot of fun to run alongside the slow moving freight cars, and jump on the ladders for a free ride (and probably a good way to farewell the weird hobo dude). So I thought that Brian, as the expert on train riding, might show me how that was done (since he had done it so many times and all (so he said). He said that I should just go on

ahead first (sort of in the Chicago-Land gentleman style of things as in: "You go first, since you are my guest"). Well, I did and had a great time at it on a few different lines. The Southern Pacific, and I think the Santa Fe were the two with the nicest ladders. Finally, a helicopter flew over head, and like two 10 year olds, Brian and I waved hello (premonition of me working on helos later in the Army – something else I should thank Brian for, but not on that day)! Shortly afterwards, a squad car (alerted by the helo), with Chicago-Land cops in it arrived.

The officers were kind enough to escort us home to Uncle Paul's (after a lengthy cop-scolding, and free information about the prison cells in Joliet). When we arrived at the house, the officers had a private chat with Uncle Paul and Aunt Mary Anne. That led to a follow-up private chat with Uncle Paul and Brian (though based on the way Brian was walking after that chat, I think it was more than a chat and Uncle Paul had just shown Brian, the business side of his leather belt). As for me? I was a guest, and in dear ole Uncle Paul's eyes, could do no wrong (after all, I was Jody's youngest)! Maybe, all those years my Mom sort of treated Paul like the baby of the family had paid off, and as my Mom always says, the "Lord passes out judgement and mercy" (depending). On that day, Uncle Paul, like the Good Lord, passed out a bit of both and I am sure, Brian and I are the better for it! We all love you Uncle Paul! Epilogue: (Brian had never before ridden on a train car ladder, and never tried to in the future).
