Philip G. Klonowski, 89, of Kankakee, passed away Friday (Jan. 10, 2014) at Presence St. Mary's Hospital, Kankakee. Visitation will be from 8:30 a.m. to 10:45 a.m. Tuesday at the Clancy-Gernon-Hertz Funeral Home, west Kankakee. A funeral Mass will follow at 11 a.m. at St. Patrick Catholic Church, Kankakee. Father John Peeters will officiate. Burial will be in Mount Calvary Cemetery, Kankakee. Memorials may be made to Hospice of Kankakee Valley or to St. Patrick Catholic Church, where he was a member and a longtime usher. Mr. Klonowski was a former 33-year employee of Kroehler Manufacturing. He was retired from the Kankakee Post Office and had also worked at Armour Pharmaceutial (CSL Behring). He was born July 18, 1924, in Kankakee, the son of Bruno and Caroline Peicha Klonowski. His wife, the former Carol Burkard, whom he married Dec. 28, 1972, at St. Stanislaus Catholic Church in Kankakee, passed away June 15, 2011. He was a veteran of the U.S. Army, serving during World War II. He loved sports, especially Notre Dame. He umpired baseball for years. Surviving are four daughters and sons-in-law, Paula and Jim Lindner, of Kankakee, Carrie and Eric Maday, of Daytona Beach, Fla., Anna and Phil Kirchner, of Bourbonnais, and Julie and Jason Fowler, of Ashkum; six grandchildren, Amy Fritz, Jay Lindner, Reese Fowler, Jackson and Max Kirchner, and Connor Maday; four great-grandchildren, Adrienne, Payton and Collin Fritz and Caity Lindner; and two brothers and sisters-in-law, Leo and Doris Klonowski, of Bourbonnais, and Jerome and Pat Klonowski, of Kankakee.
