Randall J. "Randy" Waselewski, age 73, of Bourbonnais passed away Monday, December 8, 2025 at his home. He was born August 27, 1952 in Kankakee, the son of Stanley & Marjorie (Johnston) Waselewski. Randy married Lana Beaupre on February 5, 2000.
