Randell Arseneau -- Beaverville Visitation for Randell "Rip" Arseneau, 82, of Beaverville, will be from 4 p.m. to 8 p.m. Sunday at Clancy-Gernon-Houk Funeral Home in St. Anne with an 8 p.m. wake service. A funeral Mass will be celebrated at 11 a.m. Monday at St. Mary's Catholic Church in Beaverville. Rev. Robert Coleman will officiate. Burial will be in St. Mary's Cemetery, Beaverville. Memorials may be made to St. Mary's Catholic Church Restoration Fund or to Hospice of Kankakee Valley. He died Thursday (Sept. 20, 2007) at Riverside Medical Center. Mr. Arseneau was postmaster for the U.S. Postal Service from 1951 to 1992. He was born Oct. 22, 1924, in Beaverville, the son of Isaac and Aldea Marquis Arseneau. He was a member of the Beaverville Fire Department for 40 years, a 4-H leader for the Beaverville Beavers 4-H Club for 40 years and a member of St. Mary's Catholic Church in Beaverville. He served during World War II in the U.S. Army from 1944 to 1946, where he served as chaplain's assistant. He enjoyed hunting, fishing, gardening, working at the Iroquois County Fair and woodworking. Surviving are his wife, the former Elaine Nourie, whom he married Oct. 16, 1948, in Beaverville; two sons and daughters-in-law, Steve and Becky Arseneau of St. Anne, Tony and Tina Arseneau of Cerro Gordo; one daughter, Carrie Wren and friend Gary Kemp of Beaverville; eight grandchildren and 16 great-grandchildren; four sisters, Norma Cyr and Marge Harris of Florida, Eula Goselin of Aroma Park, Via Garrett of Beaverville; and one brother and sister-in-law, William "Pete" and Diane Arseneau of

Beaverville. Deceased are one sister, Marie Gibson; and one brother, Arnold "Banjo" Arseneau.
