



Dr. Ravindra Rajmane

February 25, 1966 - December 12, 2017

Dr. Ravindra Rajmane, 51, of New York, N.Y., passed away Tuesday (Dec. 12, 2017) at his home.

He was born Feb. 25, 1966, in Solapur, India, the son of Dr. Chandrakant and Aruna Tandale Rajmane.

Dr. Rajmane was a pulmonary and critical care physician at N.Y.U. Medical Center. He was a graduate of Bradley-Bourbonnais Community High School; the University of Chicago; and Jefferson Medical College in Philadelphia, Pa.

Surviving are his sister and brother-in-law, Swati Rajmane-Warren and Stephen Warren, Rumson, N.J.; brother and sister-in-law, Kiran and Dojwala Rajmane, of Clarendon Hills; nieces and nephews, Dylan, Bianca and Annika Warren, and Akash and Anaya Rajmane; and several aunts and uncles.

Preceding him in death were his parents.

Visitation will be from noon on Tuesday until the 1 p.m. funeral service at Clancy-Gernon Funeral Home in Bourbonnais. Burial will be in All Saints Cemetery in Bourbonnais.

“ Please forgive the lateness of this message. I attended college with Ravindra -- or Ravi, as I knew him -- and only just found out about his passing this past week, via the alumni magazine.

Ravi was a sophomore when I was a freshman, and he was one of the kindest, friendliest, most supportive people I met when I first arrived at college. Perhaps it was because we were both from the hinterlands, far south of Chicago -- but I also think that it was just Ravi's natural warmth and sense of caring for others, which he always seemed to have.

We drifted a bit as college years wore on, and I'd lost touch with him since then -- but I've always remembered him with great warmth, and would be a much lesser person without his company. Ravi introduced me to so many new things and I met so many great people through him -- and he was always so supportive of anything I wanted to do. In fact, there are paths I've taken in life that I'm not sure I would have found without Ravi's presence in my life!

I met some of his family members many years ago, and he always spoke of them with great enthusiasm, especially his sister Swati (who I remember taking to the Smart Bar on the north side for dancing, where she got in an altercation with a man who had brought a snake with him to the club!) And I even had the experience of bailing Ravi out of jail once, after he had been wrongly accused during a traffic stop in Hyde Park. He was completely shaken by his ill treatment by the police, and I was able to get him out in the middle of the night and back home safely.

I have so many wonderful memories of Ravi, far too many to list here -- but I would be honored if any of the family members want to get in touch, and would be happy to help if there is anything I can do.
