March 16, 1941 - February 28, 2005

Visitation for Raymond R. "Ray" Guiney, 63, of Bradley, will be from 4-8 p.m. today at the Clancy-Gernon Funeral Home, Bourbonnais. Private inurnment will be in Kankakee Memorial Gardens. Memorials may be made to St. Paul Lutheran Building Fund or to the American Cancer Society. He died Monday (Feb. 28, 2005) at his home after a long and courageous battle with cancer. Mr. Guiney was a retired employee of Bourbonnais Elementary School District 53. He was born March 16, 1941, in Kankakee, the son of Howard and Margaret Hubertz Guiney. His parents are deceased. Surviving are his wife, the former Linda Mae Nesbitt, of Bradley, whom he married April 23, 1966, at St. Paul's Lutheran Church, Kankakee; one daughter and son-in-law, Marilyn and Brian Gold of Frankfort; one son and daughter-in-law, Karl M. and Dawn Guiney of Bourbonnais; one sister, Mary Rush of Fremont, Ohio; two sisters-in-law and one brother-in-law, Bonnie and Jerome Jordan of Herscher, Kathleen Guiney Haslett of Crystal Lake; five grandchildren, Ryan, Jared and Tyler Gold and Matthew and Michael Guiney; father-in-law and mother-in-law, Robert and Mary Nesbitt of Kankakee; and several nieces and nephews. Three brothers, Howard, John and Harold; one sister, Lorraine Bertrand; and two nephews, Clayton Twait and Ricky Rush, are deceased. He was a 1959 graduate of Kankakee High School, where he was co-captain of the football team. Mr. Guiney served in the U.S. Army. He was a lifetime member of St. Paul's Lutheran Church, where he was an usher and a member of the Counting Board. He was a coach for Lions Little League and played

slow-pitch softball with Azzarelli Cardinals. He was elected to the Kankakee Bowlers Association Hall of Fame in 1999 and had been a member of the tournament committee. He loved bowling and was an avid NASCAR fan and Cubs and Bears fan.
