Raymond McGinnis -- Bradley Raymond F. McGinnis, 76, of Bradley, died Saturday (Feb. 24, 2007) at Provena Heritage Village, Kankakee, after a short illness. He was born March 25, 1930, in Bradley, the son of Gerald and Violet Richmond McGinnis. His wife, the former Geneva F. Fox, whom he married July 31, 1965, at Wesley United Methodist Church, Bradley, died Oct. 3, 2006. He served in the U.S. Air Force during the Korean Conflict and was a lifetime member of VFW Post 9961. He was also a member of the Vintage Squadron and designed its flag. He was a certified firearms instructor, a member of the Auxiliary Civil Defense, the Crete Fleet Boat Club, Kankakee, and the Kankakee River Patrol. He was an avid hunter. He enjoyed spending time with his grandchildren. Surviving are one son and two daughters-in-law, Kevin and Linda McGinnis of Bradley, Karen McGinnis of Bourbonnais; two daughters and sons-in-law, Cathy and Michael Carstens of Kankakee, Michelle and Tim Geary of Bourbonnais; nine grandchildren; four great-grandchildren and one on the way; and two brothers and one sister-in-law, Gerald and Joan McGinnis of Bradley, and Glen McGinnis of Hawaii. Deceased are his parents, and two sons, Michael McGinnis and Mark McGinnis.
