Rell Yohnka -- Clifton Rell Berns Yohnka, 90, of Clifton, formerly of Chebanse, died Monday (March 20, 2006) at the Merkle Knipprath Catholic Home in Clifton, after a short illness. Visitation will be from 4-8 p.m. Wednesday at the Clancy-Gernon Funeral Home in Bourbonnais. A funeral Mass will be celebrated at 11 a.m. Thursday at Sts. Mary and Joseph Catholic Church in Chebanse. Burial will be in Sts. Mary and Joseph Cemetery, Chebanse. Memorials may be made to the Merkle-Knipprath Catholic Home. Mrs. Yohnka retired from Louis Schultz Insurance Agency in Chebanse and was a former high school secretary for Chebanse High School. She was born Dec. 10, 1915, in Chebanse, the daughter of Herman and Florence Allstead Berns. Her husband, William A. Yohnka, whom she married Nov. 26, 1942 at Sts. Mary and Joseph Catholic Church, died Oct. 11, 1994. She was a member of St. Martin of Tours Catholic Church, Kankakee, the Catholic Daughters of Americas and the K of C Auxiliary. Mrs. Yohnka and her sister, Christine "The Berns twins" were known for their beautiful singing voices and sang for many special occasions in the Chebanse area. Surviving are two sons and daughters-in-law, Paul and Linda Yohnka of Las Vegas, Dennis and Terry Yohnka of Joliet; three daughters and sons-in-law, Susanne and James Hildebrand of Kankakee, Delores and Sam Ashmore of Springfield, Teresa and Thomas Anderson of Chicago; her twin sister, Christine Dubuque of Clifton; 14 grandchildren and 11 great-grandchildren.
