Visitation for Richard E. Beckner, 77, of Kankakee, will be from 4 p.m. Friday until the 7:30 p.m. services at the Clancy-Gernon-Hertz Funeral Home, west Kankakee. Pastor Steve Goodin will officiate. Mr. Beckner retired from Thomas Baird and Son Plumbing & Heating after 36 years of service. He was born Oct. 6, 1932, in Bradley, the son of Robert and Velma Suprenant Beckner. He was a veteran of the U.S. Navy and a member of Kankakee American Legion Post 85. He was also a member of the Moose Lodge. Surviving are his wife, the former Phyllis A. Arseneau, of Kankakee, whom he married Dec. 11, 1953, in Danville; one daughter and son-in-law, Kris and Lonnie Arthur, of Bourbonnais; four granddaughters, Andrea Arthur of Mesa, Ariz., Melissa and Jared Miller, of Corpus Christi, Texas, Stacy Arthur, and Lindsey and Curtiss Young, all of Gilbert, Ariz.; four great-grandchildren, Madison Arthur, Jayden Arthur, Lincoln Miller and Brody Young; stepmother, Laura Ratkie of Springfield; one brother, Ronald Beckner of Springfield; one stepsister and stepbrother-in-law, Cathy and Larry Sanderson, of Springfield; many nieces and nephews, including special nephew Robert Beckner and special niece Carol Beckner, both of Kankakee; and one sister-in-law, Josie Beckner of Bourbonnais.
