Mr. Bachand was the St. Anne postmaster from 1953 until retiring in 1984. He owned and operated Bachand's Department Store in St. Anne for 10 years. He was born Nov. 29, 1918, in St. Anne, the son of Arthur and Edna Ducharme Bachand. He was treasurer of St. Anne High School District 302 for 23 years, past member of St. Anne Village Board, township clerk, member of the St. Anne Chamber of Commerce and a past member of the United Way Board. He coached CYO basketball for several years and enjoyed young people. He served in the U.S. Navy from 1943-1945. He was an instructor in aviation mechanics at the Naval Air Technical Training Center in Norman, Okla. He was a member of the St. Anne American Legion Post 842 for 60 years. He enjoyed hunting, fishing and golfing. Surviving are his wife, the former Alice Marie Sense, of Kankakee, whom he married Aug. 11, 1940 at St. Anne Catholic Church; two sons and one daughter-in-law, Robert A. Bachand Jr. of Chicago, Steven L. and Patricia Bachand of New Lenox; one daughter, Catherine Bachand of Barrington; two granddaughters, Stephanie Bachand of Evanston, Kristin Bachand of New Lenox; and his stepmother, Francis Hardesty of St. Anne.
