June 20, 1918 - November 22, 2004

Robert D. DeLoughary, 86, of Bourbonnais, formerly of Munster, Ind., died Monday (Nov. 22, 2004) at ManorCare Health Services, Kankakee, after a short illness. Visitation will be from 10 a.m. Saturday until the noon services at the Clancy-Gernon Funeral Home, 295 Main St. NW in Bourbonnais. Burial will be in Chapel Lawn Memorial Gardens, Schererville, Ind. Mr. DeLoughary served with the U.S. Air Force from 1942-1970, retiring June 30, 1970 as a Lieutenant Colonel. He was awarded the American Campaign Medal, the European-African-Middle Eastern Campaign Medal, the National Defense Service Medal, the Air Force Outstanding Unit Award, the Small Arms Expert Marksmanship Ribbon, the Distinguished Unit Citation, the Air Force Longevity Service Award Ribbon with one Silver Oak Leaf Cluster and one Bronze Oak Leaf Cluster. He was born June 20, 1918, in Green Bay, Wis., the son of David and Cerina DeKerf DeLoughary. His wife, the former Hazel Larson, whom he married Sept. 9, 1944 at St. Kevin's Church in Chicago, is deceased. Surviving are one sister-in-law, Marlene Grant of Bourbonnais; one brother-in-law, Edwin (Irene) Larson of Dowagiac, Mich.; four nieces and one nephew; and many great-nieces and great-nephews. One son, Robert E. DeLoughary, is deceased. He loved Big Band music.
