Robert Whittemore -- Kankakee Robert L. Whittemore, 92, of Kankakee, died Thursday (Oct. 6, 2005) due to injuries sustained in an automobile accident. There will be no visitation or services. Cremation rites will be accorded. Arrangements are by the Clancy-Gernon-Hertz Funeral Home, west Kankakee. He was born Feb. 22, 1913, to Hiram and Kathryn Durham Whittemore. He was a retired farmer. In his spare time he golfed, played bridge and bowled. He scored two holes-in-one and at the age of 85, he shot his age twice. Mr. Whittemore named and co-founded the Exline Sportsman's Club and served as president for several years. He recently received recognition for being a 70-year member of Asbury United Methodist Church in Kankakee. He served in the U.S. Army Air Force during World War II as an engineer on B-52 fighter planes. He was stationed in Africa and England during the war. After the war he returned to Kankakee where he farmed his family farm and raised a family with his wife of 60 years, the former Bernice Wisner. He is survived by his wife; four children and their spouses, Martha and Richard Melman of Winnetka, John and Laurie Whittemore, Mark and Cheryl Whittemore, all of Momence, Kay and Kevin McLaren of St. Anne; and 10 grandchildren, RJ, Amie, Jerrod, Matthew, Meghan, Molly, Kelsey, Michael, Carly and Bobby. He was preceded in death by his parents and three siblings, Edwin, Elizabeth and Hiram. He would claim his key to longevity was avoiding vegetables that were green and started with the letter "B." He loved his wife Bea's legendary pies, jellied chicken and poached egg on toast. He loved

Chicago sports, especially the Cubs and the Sox. He also was a fan of the Kankakee High School sports program. He lived a life of honor and quiet grace. He never raised his voice in anger and approached the world with a sharp wit and an open mind. His favorite adages were "Buy low and sell high," and "A job begun is a job half done." He will be dearly missed.

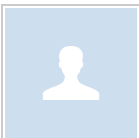
